- Discussion regarding online facility booking

Barry Lavers, Director of Recreation, Parks & Facilities, reported that former Treasurer, Paul Dowber, submitted a report to the Administration and Finance Committee regarding online facility booking. There would be a onetime setup and training fee of \$15,000 and a monthly fee of \$1,000. Credit card payments would need to be accepted. Mr. Lavers checked the Town of Minto online booking system. Facility calendars are checked and a request form is completed and submitted to the Recreation Department, who then must follow up on the inquiry. Mr. Lavers commented that the system is very expensive and wouldn't make much of a change in the way facilities are currently booked since the renter must be contacted to complete the booking, similar to our current process.

Mark MacKenzie, Mount Forest Facility Manager, advised that he was contacted by a group that planted trees in memory or deceased family members at Murphy Park. Twenty trees have been planted. They have requested permission to install a board with names on it. He has asked them to submit a proposal and suggested that an area be designated for planting trees. Committee suggested that Mark request the group submit a proposal for the Committee to review. A policy regarding species and where trees are to be planted may be needed.

Karren Wallace, Clerk, informed the Committee that the Township now has a minimal scent policy and requested the Facility Managers let her know how many entrance signs are needed. It was noted that this is for public education and that individuals cannot be banned from a facility for wearing scents.

Mayor Lennox informed the Committee that the Patriots have contacted him to request an expansion of their liquor licence to a corner of the walking track. The Committee requested that the Patriots submit a proposal to the Recreation Department and the Director bring a report to Committee after sufficient information is provided to him by the Patriots.

Michael Givens, CAO, announced that renovations will take place at the Kenilworth office sometime between April and September and staff will need to move during the eight weeks of renovation. He will be consulting the Facility Managers regarding relocating office staff.

Tom Bowden, Arthur Facility Manager, advised that he has been working with the Arthur Historical Society to place display cases along a wall in the area where the elevator is located.




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

HOCKEY CANADA PUTS AGE-APPROPRIATE PROGRAMMING AT FOREFRONT FOR 2017-18 SEASON

New policy mandates cross-ice and half-ice hockey for Initiation-aged players

CALGARY, Alta. – Hockey Canada wants all of Canada on the same page when it comes to the delivery of its Initiation Program – traditionally a player's first brush with organized hockey at the ages of five and six.

Although the Initiation Program – originally developed more than 35 years ago – always recommended cross-ice or half-ice small-area games, its delivery has varied from community to community. Beginning in the upcoming 2017-18 season, a new Hockey Canada policy now mandates that Initiation-aged players receive age-appropriate programming on cross-ice or half-ice surfaces.

"You would never put a five- or six-year-old child on a full-size soccer pitch, or expect them to play basketball without any adjustments made for their size. Hockey is no different," said Paul Carson, vice-president of membership development for Hockey Canada, who notes that while some provinces and communities already deliver cross-ice programming at the Initiation level, others have always utilized full ice for practices and games.

"The Initiation Program was developed to allow kids to have fun, learn skills, and develop confidence," said Carson. "Re-sizing the playing surface to cross-ice or half-ice means more puck-touches, which result in more chances to practice puck-control and shooting, as well as overall more movement and motor skill-development – twisting, turning, balance, coordination, agility. Their field-of-play matches their size, and these players hone in on their skill-development in a way that larger ice surfaces just aren't conducive to."

The differences in skill-development opportunities with cross-ice or half-ice hockey are significant: players receive five times more passes and take six times more shots. They're called on to have to make more decisions more quickly, and are overall more engaged in the game.

Special boards and bumpers have been developed that allow for quick and easy division of a regular-sized rink into two half-ice surfaces or three cross-ice rinks, with options to create different small-area configurations. Not only does re-sizing the playing surface allow for Initiation-aged players to develop their hockey skills more effectively, it also allows communities to maximize their ice time by safely putting more teams and games on the ice at one time.

Hockey Canada and its 13 members across the country are coordinating on a communication plan to ensure hockey administrators and coaches receive the resources required to align with the new mandate.

Resources such as the Hockey Canada Network – a best-in-class skill-development resource geared to coaches – features information on the purpose of cross-ice hockey and how to run effective on-ice sessions for the five- and six-year-old Initiation age group.

Instruction on delivering age-appropriate programming will also be available to coaches trained in the National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP) Coach 1 – Intro Coach. This clinic, delivered by Hockey Canada's 13 members, is geared towards coaches of entry-level players to provide resources that will aid in the implementation of skill-development and game play.

Hockey Canada has also produced a video that features renowned sport scientist Dr. Steve Norris; Olympic, World Cup, world, and Stanley Cup champion Sidney Crosby (Cole Harbour, N.S./Pittsburgh, NHL); Memorial Cup, World Cup, and IIHF World Championship-winning coach Bill Peters (Three Hills, Alta./Carolina, NHL); and Olympic gold-medallist and two-time IIHF Women's World Championship silver-medallist Brianne Jenner (Oakville, Ont./Calgary, CWHL) describing the importance of small area games and cross-ice/half-ice hockey.



New Cross-Ice and Half-Ice Mandatory Policy From Hockey Canada Requires Communication and Careful Consideration With User Groups

MARCH 31, 2017 - The recent announcement by Hockey Canada to mandate cross-ice and half-ice for initiation aged players in the 2017/18 season requires all recreation facility managers to be prepared to work closely with local hockey organizations to ensure any change in current use (or pas practice) is jointly approved. Read <u>Hockey Canada Announcement</u>.

No argument that increasing facility use and promoting healthy lifestyles are a benefit to all communities across Canada. However, with this new announcement from Hockey Canada comes a need for greater communication between both the facility owner and user group. The Ontario Recre Facilities Association Inc. (ORFA) recommends that all recreation facility managers contact local league officials to remind them of the tenant landle relationship that currently exists between those who use the buildings and those who are in fact legally responsible for maintaining a safe environn arena design is constructed to various codes, regulations and standards that must be respected by both parties. Any item that is added to an ice su that is not of standard operating practice of the facility increases the potential for joint liability if not properly planned and approved.

Any item used to divide an ice surface will not:

- Be a barrier to egress both on and off the ice
- · Create a trip hazard on the ice and further, when the device is removed, it must not create an indentation in the ice surface caused by melting
- · Contravene the Fire Code requirements for materials, sprinkler systems, or be stored in mechanical or electrical rooms

Other discussion points may also include:

- Prior to any league considering purchasing manufactured ice rink division systems an agreement with facility management must be reached regarding storage. Ice arenas often already lack adequate storage space and these systems often require large areas for storage year-round. It these items for maintenance, cleaning or conflict with other facility rentals will often be an added unbudgeted cost to facility operations.
- That set-up and removal be agreed upon, including any expectations regarding the wearing of personal protective equipment should it be agreed that users will be responsible for their own set up.
- Further that time required for any set up and take down of dividers form part of the set user time allotment with no extension of use being acc
- Safe and proper storage of any non-facility owned equipment. This may require further clarification of insurance coverage for theft, fire or water damage while not being used.
- That with increased users on the ice, comes a greater need for access to dressing rooms; which may already be challenged due to facility age design.
- That the municipality/facility owner be added to the third party's CGL policy as an additional insured.

The ORFA recommends that any item used to divide an ice surface shall be:

- Approved by facility management prior to use
- · Soft in nature and not create a trip hazard
- · Removed from the facility after each use unless identified and approved within the user agreement
