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PUBLIC MEETING - MINUTES

Monday, June 28, 2010

The Public Meeting was held Monday, June 28, 2010 at 7:00 p.m. at the Township of Wellington North Council Chambers, Kenilworth to consider a Zoning Amendment application.

THE LOCATION being rezoned is in Part of Lot 4, Concession 10, former Township of West Luther, with a civic address of 8185 Tenth Line. The land is approximately 74.6 acres in size.

THE PURPOSE AND EFFECT of the amendment is to rezone the retained farm parcel to A-97, restricting future residential development on the agricultural portion of the property and to rezone the severed parcel to A-98, recognizing existing non-complying accessory buildings and requiring that the number of livestock on the property complies with MDS 2 setbacks as measured from the severed parcel's property line. This rezoning is a condition of severance application B9/10, that has been granted provisional consent by the Wellington County Land Division Committee. The consent will sever the existing farm dwelling from the remainder of the agricultural parcel as per the surplus farm dwelling policies. The property is currently zoned Agricultural.

- 1. Notice for this public meeting was sent to required agencies and property owners within 120 m as well as posted on the property on June 7, 2010.

2. Presentations by:

Linda Redmond, Planner, reviewed correspondence dated June 21, 2010 prepared by Charlie Toman, Planner.

The rezoning is required as a condition of provisional consent (B09/10) by the Wellington County Land Division Committee. The Planning Department did not have any concerns with implementing this decision. Both the Provincial Policy Statement and Wellington County Official Plan provide for surplus farm dwelling severances, provided the retained lands are rezoned to prohibit future residential dwellings. It is not usual to maintain an existing barn for storage and restrict its use for livestock. The amendment deems the barn and other accessory buildings to meet the zoning by-law in terms of building height, floor areas and hobby barn regulations. In the current case, the property owners have indicated that it is their intention to sell the severed parcel and to ensure flexibility for prospective purchasers. The site specific zoning amendment includes a requirement that the MDS 2 is met to the property line of the neighbouring dwellings.

The consent will sever the existing farm dwelling, barn and other accessory buildings (5.5 acres) from the remainder of the agricultural parcel (69.1 acres). The property is currently zoned Agricultural. The purpose of the amendment is to rezone the subject lands to restrict any future residential development on the agricultural portion of the property and to regulate the housing of livestock in the existing barn/accessory buildings.

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As a result of the severance, the residential dwelling would be considered the main use and the farm buildings would be accessory. The existing buildings would exceed the allowable ground floor area of 1,000 sq. ft. (Section 6.1.4 ii) and allowable ground floor area for a hobby barn (Section 8.3.1). These deficiencies should be recognized in the rezoning. Mr. Toman did not have concerns with providing this relief.

The applicant's solicitor has indicated that the severed parcel is being listed for sale and they do not know what type of livestock a prospective purchaser may wish to raise. Therefore, the applicants have requested that the number of nutrient units permitted on the parcel is limited to five.

The minimum distance separation required from a hobby farm containing five total nutrient units will vary depending on the type of livestock and manure/material storage. From running a number of MDS 1 and 2 reports on the proposed severed parcel and surrounding dwellings. The majority of typical hobby farm livestock (i.e. horses) equalling five nutrient units will meet both MDS setback requirements. However, there are a small number of livestock (i.e. Feeder Pigs) which, due to high odour potential, would exceed MDS 2 setbacks at only five nutrient units. Therefore a regulation was added in the draft by-law requiring that the MDS 2 be met for any livestock usage of the barn, opposed to restricting the number of nutrient units to five as requested by the applicant. Compliance with MDS 2 is calculated by the Chief Building Official at the time of building permit.

Vincent Starratt, Grant & Acheson, was present to represent the applicant. His clients and the potential purchasers would like to keep the barn. Restricting the zoning would be a safeguard from having larger animal units in the barn. The potential purchasers would like to use the barn for a couple of horses and storage.

6. Comments/questions from Council.

Councillor Matusinec supported the application. He felt that it wouldn't make sense to tear down a perfectly good barn and then build another.

Councillor Chaulk was in favour of the application but did have concerns as there is a barn and a shed on the property and questioned if it will still have an agricultural tax classification.

Councillor Mason was in agreement with the application.

Mayor Broomhead reviewed the concerns of the Chief Building Official regarding the difficulty of enforcing the number of animal units.

Ms. Minshall, Greg Zwiers, hydrogeologist, and Dale Murray, municipal representative appeared before Council. Ms. Minshall presented a review of the Arthur Drinking Water Systems Vulnerability and Threats Assessment. The Characterization Reports, Terms of Reference and Technical Studies are complete. Assessment Reports will progress in 2010. Source Protection Plans will be complete by 2012.

The Assessment Report will describe watershed characteristics; identify vulnerable areas related to drinking water supplies and potential threats to water quality and quantity and rank activities as potential threats – low, medium or high. The report will be based on existing reports and studies as well as new, peer-reviewed technical studies. A draft report will be available in August 2010 for review.

Through the Drinking Water Stewardship Fund there are grants available to landowners for decommissioning old wells, upgrading existing wells and septic systems, erosion control and business pollution prevention reviews.

The Ministry of Environment completes the scoring to determine vulnerability. The Arthur area is not considered to be particularly vulnerable.

Minutes of the May 18th meeting were previously approved and circulated to Council.

Business arising from the May 18th meeting:

- The final walk through of the Mount Forest Main Street project was done on June 23rd. Engineer, contractor, Twp staff and BIA reps participated. Some minor deficiencies were identified but the main issue was the condition of the trees. Solutions are being investigated.
- The request for Jake brake signage on Highway #6 at the south of Arthur has been denied by the MTO
- The County has not yet responded regarding the parking concerns at the Mount Forest Library. Twp should send County a letter regarding the repairs needed along the north side of library property. Township still has a \$1,900 damage deposit.

1) 2010 Connecting Link Application

Gary reported that our 2010 Connecting Link application included the bridge on Highway #6 at the south end of Mount Forest and the third phase of the Mount Forest Connecting Link (Queen St – south limit). We just received a letter from MTO informing us that this year's application was denied. We will apply again this Fall.

2) Mitchell's Creek Erosion

We have received a letter from K Smart and Associates informing us that the field work has been completed and the project is now in the design stages. The County will also be kept informed since our proposed work could have an impact on the County Road #109 bridge.

3) Sidewalk Inspections

Gary reported that the Foremen have completed the sidewalk inspections in Arthur and Mount Forest. Deficiencies have been marked with paint and we have started to make repairs either by grinding or replacing sections in the priority areas. We are still planning to arrange a demonstration of sidewalk mud jacking as a possible solution to address some of our deficiencies.

We feel it would be better to replace the mower rather than spend money on repairs for the current mower which could be traded in when it is still worth something. \$10,000 was included in the Maintenance Budget to either repair or trade for a new mower. Foreman Dale obtained the following quotes:

Please find attached the quote to replace the wall in front of the Arthur Legion. This is a very specialized job due to the type of wall and the walls proximity to the Legion wall and the front porch of the house at the corner of George St and Eliza St. The project also includes replacing the steps that provide access onto George St. The estimated cost for completing this work is \$94,360 plus applicable taxes and plus the engineering that had to be done at a cost of approx \$2,000.

This project will also require the sidewalk that runs in front of the existing wall to be removed and at that time we will have repairs done to the existing curb as well. This work will be completed by Hillis Construction who is doing other curb work for the Township in Arthur. Hillis's estimate is approximately \$24,000 to complete the sidewalk and curbing. This cost will depend on how much damage occurs to the curb during the removal of the existing wall and sidewalk.

We have already completed a survey of the property lines along the wall at a cost of \$2,200.

Based on above the estimate cost to complete the project is \$122,560. There is a \$125,000 included in this year's budget to complete this project.

The contactor is scheduling to start on the wall by the middle of August and have it completed by mid September. We will still need to replace the sidewalk and curbing after the wall has been completed.

A Call to Action

- The Challenge to the Minimum Maintenance Standards

The legality of the Minimum Maintenance Standards (MMS) is currently being challenged. An application has been filed with the Superior Court of Justice to declare MMS null and void. The hearing of this application will be held in the fall of 2010.

Ontario Good Roads Association (OGRA) is filing a notice with the Court opposing this application.

MMS were created to help municipalities defend legal actions alleging non repair of roads. These standards provide municipalites with not only a framework for road maintenance but also a third defence under Section 44 of the Ontario Municipal Act. It states:

"A municipality is not liable for failing to keep a highway or bridge in a reasonable state of repair if,

"c) at the time the cause of action arose, minimum standards established under section (4) applied to the highway or bridge and to the alleged default and those standards have been met." The application filed with the Superior Court of Justice is seeking to remove this defence. If successful, not only will all motor vehicle accidents (MVA) going forward be impacted but also all open MVAs within the dates November 1, 2002 to March 6, 2010.

Recently, OGRA sent a letter to all their municipal members. They have asked for your assistance to help them fund this legal challenge.

Frank Cowan Company supports the OGRA initiative and urges all municipal members to do the same.

The History of Minimum Maintenance Standards

Prior to November 1, 2002

The Municipal Act, RSO 1990, Section 44. (1) places liability for road maintenance on the municipality that has jurisdiction over the road. This section is written as:

"Maintenance – The municipality that has jurisdiction over a highway or bridge shall keep it in a state of repair that is reasonable in the circumstances, including the character and location of the highway or bridge."

Defences to liability were set out in Section 44. (3) and written as follows:

"A municipality is not liable for failing to keep a highway or bridge in a reasonable state of repair if,

a) it did not know and could not have been expected to have known about the state of repair of the highway or bridge;

b) it took reasonable steps to prevent the default from arising.

Significance

If a municipality knew, or it was deemed, it ought to have known, a state of disrepair existed the municipality would be found liable in a motor vehicle accident (MVA). This was in accordance with common law principles that govern the law in Ontario.

November 1, 2002

In order to provide municipalities with some relief against liability, Minimum Maintenance Standards (MMS) were developed. On November 1, 2002, Regulation 239/02 was enacted. The regulation was amended by Regulation 23/2010.

MMS provided municipalities with a third defence against road liability claims. This defence is incorporated into the Municipal Act, RSO 1990, Section 44 (3) and is written as follows:

(c) at the time the cause of action arose, minimum standards established under subsection (4) applied to the highway or bridge and to the alleged default and those standards have been met."

The Reason for the Legal Challenge Against MMS

In Thornhill vs. York, Justice Howden (2008) opined that MMS may not be enforceable as he was of the opinion that the

Ontario Legislature did not have the authority to empower the Minister to create the regulation. The legal term applied is "ultra vires" which means "outside of the government's legislative realm". However, in the case of Thornhill vs. York, Justice Howden did not rule on this point as it was not before the Court.

MMS have protected municipalities from liability that would be applied under normal common law principles. Therefore motorists injured in MVAs must meet a higher level of proof of liability than in other situations that may cause injury. This is the main reason Justice Howden made his comments on the legality of MMS.

Since the release of the Thornhill judgement, Plaintiff Counsels have made threats of challenging MMS. Some have pled the fact that the MMS are ultra vires in Statements of Claim. However, none of these cases have come to trial, yet.

The Legal Challenge

In the case of Silveira vs. Vaughn, York et al., a motion was brought to remove the issue of MMS as being ultra vires from the trial and instead decide the issue by a separate motion. The sitting Judge, Justice Lauwers, granted the motion and the matter is to be heard in the fall of 2010.

This will bring some order to the hearing and interveners are allowed to make submissions.

What happens if the MMS are abolished?

Claimants involved in MVAs, who bring actions against the municipality, will have a much lower burden of proof. The municipality can no longer use the defence of having met the minimum standard of care. Claimants will not have to prove that the municipality knew about the state of disrepair. They will only have to prove the municipality knew or ought to have known of the disrepair.

This will serve to increase the number of judgments against municipalities and adversely impact the cost of claims and therefore the cost of insurance.

Dear Mayor & Members of Council:

As you know, the Minimum Maintenance Standards (MMS) were created to help Ontario municipalities manage their risk from legal action stemming from personal injury on municipal roads. Unfortunately, claims are repeatedly brought against road authorities for personal injury and property damage alleging inadequate maintenance of roads, signage or failing to provide proper winter deicing, sanding and/or plowing. The MMS have been very successful in defending against these claims. If the municipality can show that they were following the minimum level of maintenance set out in the regulations, plaintiffs are often discouraged from proceeding with their claims either by their lawyers or upon presentation of proof in discovery. Further, upon making it to the Courts, usually with a claim for catastrophic injury, the courts have been looking for the compliance with MMS with regards to municipal liability.

Recently an application was filed with the Superior Court of Justice to have the Minimum Maintenance Standards declared null and void. This application has been filed by individuals who have also filed suit against a municipality for a winter related accident. The municipality is attempting to defend the action, in part, by proving that they were in compliance with the Minimum Maintenance Standards.

The application to have an order declaring the MMS null and void, if successful, will have huge implications for all Ontario municipalities. Municipalities, who are exercising due diligence and maintaining their roads in good repair, or providing excellent winter maintenance, will no longer have a viable defence against spurious claims of liability. With no viable defence, claims that might otherwise be thrown out will continue onto expensive trials and old claims could possibly be re-filed. The courts may once again start awarding large settlements which will result in higher insurance premiums for municipalities. For this reason the Ontario Good Roads Association is filing notice with the court that we wish to oppose the application on behalf of our municipal members.

OGRA does not have the financial resources to defend this application and any subsequent appeals, which potentially could go as high as the Supreme Court of Canada. We are therefore turning to you, our members, to ask you to consider contributing to a "MMS Litigation Fund". A small contribution to the fund will greatly assist OGRA in fighting this application on behalf of all our members.

We are suggesting that each municipality consider contributing 10¢ per-capita with the maximum contribution capped at \$50,000 and the minimum being \$1,000. We appreciate that municipal budgets are stretched; however a small contribution now could save significant money in the future. Please feel free to contribute whatever you can to the cause. Any funds not used will be refunded back to contributing municipalities on a pro-rated basis.

In 2009 Wellington North was granted funding under the Build Canada – Communities Component for the replacement of the Durham Street pumping station. Part of this project involved the reconstruction of Normanby Street and the replacement of services under the street.

The Normanby work was done in 2009 to be finished in 2010 with the placement of the final lift of asphalt.

Tenders were called for the pumping station earlier this spring and they closed at the end of June. A letter from BM Ross outlines the results of the tender opening and recommends that the contract be given to Xterra Construction Inc.

Attached to this report is a spreadsheet that shows both the pumping station contract and the Normanby contract and the related Build Canada funding for each. The costs submitted with the Build Canada grant application are also included.

1. Credit card acceptance

There was a discussion about the acceptance of credit cards by the Township to collect for fees, charges, etc. specifically in the Recreation Department but elsewhere as well. 2. 2009 financial statement

John reported on the status of the 2009 financial statement. It is hoped that it will be available in July.

3. Project tender adoption presentation

John presented a sample report of a format that should be prepared for Council when a tender is recommended to Council for acceptance. The intention is to provide all of the estimated costs associated with a project including the tender and all sources of funding for the project including the current budget. In addition to the spreadsheet providing the summary of costs and revenues, a written report would describe the project further.

4. Investment policy

John presented a draft investment policy for review. The policy provides guidance to staff responsible for investing surplus cash. John was asked to make the text of the policy less technical and easier to understand. He will have a final version available for the next Finance Committee meeting for recommendation to Council.

5. Fees and charges

Another draft of a Fees and Charges bylaw was reviewed.

6. Banking agreement

John reviewed with the committee the proposed new banking agreement with the Township banker. The previous agreement paid interest to the Township on all balances in all the Township's bank accounts on a consolidated basis. The new agreement will pay interest on each account independently and at a rate that increases according to defined balance thresholds.

Since amalgamation, the Township has not tendered for banking services. The Township's current banker is the Royal Bank of Canada. John was asked to contact the other banks represented in Wellington North.

7. Budget presentation

John had been asked to prepare a "pie chart" to better present the level of spending included in the 2010 budget. This was presented and John was instructed to make it available to Councillors at the June 28 Council meeting and to add it to the Township website





Dear Mayor Downer and Council Members,

I am contacting you on behalf of North Simcoe Emergency and Transitional Residential Projects Inc, (more formally known as Shelter Now). We have recently sent a letter to the Hon. James Bradley from the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing requesting to have Part I, Section 5K of the Residential Tenancies Act changed as it doesn't speak for transitional housing providers reasonably.

Shelter Now is representing The Simcoe County Alliance to End Homelessness, The Simcoe County Transitional Housing Network along with various community partners to have this current legislation changed.

The Act reads as follows: Part I, Section 5, exemptions from the Act. The Act does not apply with respect to,

- (k) living accommodation occupied by a person for the purpose of receiving rehabilitative or therapeutic services agreed upon by the person and the provider of the living accommodation, where,
 - (i) the parties have agreed that,
 - (A) the period of occupancy will be of a specified duration, or
 - (B) the occupancy will terminate when the objectives of the services have been met or will not be met, and
 - (ii) the living accommodation is intended to be provided for no more than a **one-year period**;

Transitional housing is defined as temporary or interim accommodation for homeless or at-risk of homelessness individuals and/or families that is combined with case managed support services,

aimed at helping these individuals to transition to long-term and permanent housing, self-sufficiency and independence (National Homelessness Initiative). While transitional housing is usually longer term and more service intensive than emergency shelter, it is still time limited, with stays ranging from several months to a maximum of 1 year. Having only 1 year is quite simply not enough time to ensure the success of each individual. Some clients will require a 1 to 2 year period to gain the independence they need to be successful once they have transitioned into permanent housing.

Shelter Now is a not for profit charity and owns and operates a 20 unit transitional housing complex in Midland. Our offices are located in the lower level of the building along with other Non-Profits who support our clients above. When clients are admitted into our program they agree to a strict set of rules and must participate in our transitional housing program which is specific to each individual. Supports include, vocational counseling, employment services, financial services, nutritional and life skills training, addiction or mental health counseling and many more services. Along with other transitional housing providers, we too are discharging clients after the 1 year period only to have them fall back into system again, which in turn costs Ontario taxpayers.

We are recommending that the current legislation under Part I, Section 5K of the Act, be changed from 1 year to 2 years or adding a 1 year extension. This change would not negatively affect landlords or tenants, and therefore we do not foresee any opposition.

We are further recommending that you request the support of the County of Simcoe and The Association of Municipalities of Ontario.

BY-LAW NUMBER 54-10

BEING A BY-LAW TO CONFIRM THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WELLINGTON NORTH AT ITS REGULAR MEETING HELD ON JULY 12, 2010.

AUTHORITY: Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25, as amended, Sections 5(3) and 130.

WHEREAS the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25, as amended, Section 5(3), provides that the jurisdiction of every council is confined to the municipality that it represents and its powers shall be exercised by by-law.

AND WHEREAS the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25, as amended, Section 130 provides that every council may pass such by-laws and make such regulations for the health, safety and well-being of the inhabitants of the municipality in matters not specifically provided for by this Act and for governing the conduct of its members as may be deemed expedient and are not contrary to law.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the Township of Wellington North hereby **ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:**

- 1. That the action of the Council at its Regular Meeting held on July 12, 2010 in respect to each report, motion, resolution or other action passed and taken by the Council at its meeting, is hereby adopted, ratified and confirmed, as if each resolution or other action was adopted, ratified and confirmed by separate by-law.
- That the Mayor and the proper officers of the Township are hereby authorized and directed to do all things necessary to give effect to the said action, or to obtain approvals where required, and, except where otherwise provided, the Mayor and the Clerk are hereby directed to execute all documents necessary in that behalf and to affix the corporate seal of the Township to all such documents.
- 3. That this by-law, to the extent to which it provides authority for or constitutes the exercise by the Council of its power to proceed with, or to provide any money for, any undertaking work, project, scheme, act, matter or thing referred to in subsection 65 (1) of the Ontario Municipal Board Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter 0.28, shall not take effect until the approval of the Ontario Municipal Board with respect thereto, required under such subsection, has been obtained.
- 4. That any acquisition or purchase of land or of an interest in land pursuant to this by-law or pursuant to an option or agreement authorized by this by-law, is conditional on compliance with Environmental Assessment Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter E.18.
