Severance Application B49/10 granted provisional consent on June 10, 2010 by the Land Division Committee for the larger parcel severed from Lardeb Farms for church, school and cemetery.

Applications B104/10 and B105/10 for lot line adjustments from Lardeb Farms, adding small narrow parcels off of Wood Street to abutting residential properties were considered by the Land Division Committee on September 9.

Application B106/10 creating a 20 foot wide private drainage easement needed for development of the church, school and cemetery property was considered by the Land Division Committee on September 9.

Mr. Van Patter commented that this application is nearing the end of the process. Issues from previous meetings have been resolved. The severances were granted on September 9th. The zoning amendment is a condition of the first severance. Some minor revisions to the site plan have been recommended; however, the site plan does not need to be finalized before the zoning amendment can be passed.

The Planner had to objection to the approval of the draft zoning amendment. Drainage matters can be taken care of during the site plan control process.

RE: Livestock Damage by Coyotes

Dear Members of Council:

A recent article in the Wellington Advertiser concerning coyote damage to livestock was brought to the attention of the Wellington Federation of Agriculture by a number of farmers and non-farmers alike. We appreciate the opportunity to clarify the situation of livestock losses to wildlife.

To be clear, Ontario farmers are avid supporters of preserving wildlife. The record of Ontario farmers for investing in the environment is strong, and participation in the Environmental Farm Plan (EFP) by farmers is proof. Since April 1, 2005, Ontario farmers have invested \$270 million in environmental improvements through the EFP. Some of those improvements address the conflicts with wildlife by building predator fences and making purchases of livestock guardian animals such as sheep dogs, llamas and donkeys. Wellington North's farmers have been active participants in the Environmental Farm Plan program.

Wellington County farmers are strong supporters of the other environmental protection initiatives, such as the Rural Water Quality Program. The first decade of this program has produced over 1,200 projects. The City of Guelph and County of Wellington have contributed over \$2.8 million during that decade, and farmers and rural landowners have more than matched that generosity by adding to those funds and completing over \$12.5 million in environmental improvements. Many of those projects have involved retiring fragile lands and fencing off watercourses to create vegetative buffers--all very good projects for enhancing wildlife.

Therefore, farmers care deeply about preserving nature for all of society to enjoy. Farmers willingly share in a social and ecological partnership that helps them protect their livelihood while preserving the natural environment for present and future generations. Farmers,

however, often carry the majority of the burden when it comes to wildlife. In a recent update of the impact of wildlife on Ontario agriculture, the George Morris Centre conservatively estimated losses by farmers at \$41 million annually. The loss of sheep to predators (mostly coyotes) has increased by nearly 50% in the last decade according to the report.

Livestock farmers cannot afford to be victimized by wild predators. Once threatened by predators, farmers do have a number of wildlife management options. A combination of guardian animals, predator fencing or confinement is routine for livestock producers in the area. As predator populations increase and adapt, however, these measures will fail from time to time.

Farm organizations like the Ontario Federation of Agriculture (OFA) and the livestock commodity groups have been very active in recent years on this file. In 2009, the OFA Predator Task Team made specific recommendations that would allow for more precise control of nuisance coyotes. These are reasonable requests used in other jurisdictions and the farm organizations will persist with these requests until a reasonable response is received from the provincial government.

As a last resort, the farm communities across Ontario appreciate the long standing foresight of the provincial government in providing programs that help balance the needs of food production with the needs of preserving the natural environment. Specifically the provincial government provides leadership on this matter through the Livestock, Poultry and Honey Bee Protection Act, 1990. This Act establishes how livestock producers may be compensated by the provincial government through their local municipalities for losses due to wildlife damage. This program is funded provincially, with only a nominal administrative contribution requested from municipalities. This is not a significant burden on municipal taxpayers compared to over \$41 million lost by farmers every year due to wildlife damage. In fact the levels of compensation in this program have not changed in over a decade. As well compensation levels are based on market values and have never accounted for losses of higher value breeding stock.

In conclusion WFA would like to assure the members of Council of the Township of Wellington North that there's no "free lunch" for farmers in this program. Similarly, we want to assure the council that Wellington North farmers are not slow to take all reasonable actions to prevent their livestock from becoming an "all you can eat" buffet for coyotes.

Minutes of the July 13th meeting were previously approved and circulated to Council.

Business arising from the July 13th meeting:

- Our comments have been supplied to MOE regarding the Arthur Wastewater Treatment Plant Pilot Project and we are awaiting the next step
- A letter was sent to MOE to update our efforts to reduce inflow/infiltration in the Arthur sanitary sewer system.

Dan declared conflict of interest and left the meeting

1. OCWA

David O'Connell, Scott Craggs and Richard Lalliberte attended the meeting to review the 2nd quarter report for the operation of the Arthur and Mount Forest wastewater treatment plants. Overall the plants are at 3% under budget after the 2nd quarter. Wages continue to show the biggest overrun due to call-ins. There was also discussion regarding the timing of invoices and billings which OCWA indicated they are working on improving. David agreed to provide an estimate of year end reconciliation by end of January next year. The 2011 annual operation fee may increase slightly due to wages because the two operators running the Arthur and Mount Forest plants will not be required to assist in Drayton other than to cover off for sickness or vacation time of OCWA's Drayton operator.

Mayor Mike, David, Scott and Richard left the meeting and Dan joined the meeting at 4:35 pm

2. DWQMS Update

Gary reported that we received a draft copy of our water licences for the Arthur and Mount Forest systems. These have been reviewed by our staff and BM Ross with comments being submitted before the final licences are issued. We have also been informed that they have completed the initial audit of our DWQMS application. They are very satisfied in our application and only identified one area of improvement at this time. They will be contacting us in the near future to complete the external audit.

3. Year to Date Budget Review

The committee reviewed the year to date Water and Sewer Operational Budgets. Expenditures seem to be in line with the budget. However, some items will be exceeded by the end of the year due to adjustments made because of 2009 invoicing not being received until late Spring.

4. Staff Report (see attached)

5. Well Maintenance

IWS has completed their tests at Mount Forest Wells #4 & #6. They have submitted their findings and proposals to rehab these two remaining line shaft wells. This work is estimated between \$28,000 to \$39,000 plus taxes and will be included in the 2011 budget.

As reported at the last meeting, Well Initiatives was to provide their proposal for rehabbing Well #3 to bring it back to full capacity. Their proposal estimates a cost of \$17,250 plus taxes to rehab the well. Due to the importance of this well for emergency situations the committee agreed to have Well Initiatives proceed immediately with this maintenance work.

Two new Chlorine & PH analysers will be installed in Well #7B at a cost of \$3,600 plus taxes per unit. The same installations will be needed at four other wells next year.

6. Construction Project Up-dates

They are proceeding with testing the pumps at the Cork St SPS. The preconstruction meeting was held for the road portion of the project and Reeves plan to start the work around Sept 16th. Detour signs will be placed for access to the Sports Complex along with a notice in the paper and notices placed in the Sports Complex regarding the road closure. Reeves will keep Cork St open as long as possible.

The pre-construction meeting was held for the Durham St SPS and the contractor has started the project. They do not plan to disrupt Foster St until next Spring.

Drexler has completed the Conestoga St watermain project except for the top coat of asphalt which should be done shortly.

A public meeting was held for the sewer replacement between Frederick St and Smith St. Drexler is progressing well with the project with the connections on Frederick St being completed.

7. Treatment Plant Updates

We have received the new MOE C of A for the Mount Forest Plant which combines the new plant and the existing sludge storage facility. We needed to replace the blower motor for the sludge storage building at a cost of \$11,572 plus taxes. We continue to try to reduce the blower noise at the new plant. Kenetics Noise Control will supply additional equipment at a cost of \$6,100 plus taxes. This installation will be completed this Fall and be covered under the plant funding. Union Gas completed their inspection of the plant as per the Ontario Regulations.

We had a productive meeting with the MOE regarding the discharge at the Arthur Treatment Plant. They are willing to work with us and Triton Engineering is taking steps to gather and combine river flow information with the Grand River Conservation Authority, we are changing our alum dosage and will monitor the results regarding phosphorus, ammonia and nitrate concentrations and submit a report to MOE in February 2011 summarizing the results and with recommendations for the Spring discharge period. The land purchase for future effluent holding ponds has been completed.

There was a wastewater bypass on July 23rd at the Fredrick St SPS. We need to investigate the possible use of equalization tanks to handle heavy flow events and therefore reduce bypass occurrences.

8. Other Business

- A letter was sent out in July reminding property owners that have hydrants on their property that they need to be maintained annually
- Since we could not finalize a land deal with MTO we will complete the
 easement survey work for the watermain installed on the north side of the
 river along Hwy #6 in Arthur
- We have received our new Permit to Take Water permits for the four Mount Forest wells. The permit is good until May 2017.
- Due to ongoing water issues at the Arthur arena, additional flushing will be done in that vicinity and the Rec Dept staff is to notify the Water Department when major events are taking place and Rec Co-ordinator was requested to have her staff check/run the water before events and to call the Water Department if there is an issue before the event rather than after the event is started

WHEREAS Section 391. (1) of the Municipal Act, 2001 S.O. Chapter 25 as amended (hereinafter called "the Act") permits a municipality and a local board to pass by-laws imposing fees or charges on any class of persons; and

WHEREAS pursuant to Section 69 of *The Planning Act*, R.S.O. 1990, as amended, provides that a Council of a municipality may pass a by-law to prescribe a tariff of fees for the processing of applications made in respect of planning matters.

WHEREAS pursuant to Section 7, *Building Code Act*, S.O. 1992, c25, as amended, provides that a Council of a municipality may pass a by-law to prescribe fees for the processing of applications for permits or for the issuance of permits

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WELLINGTON NORTH ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. The fees and charges for various municipal services are established as shown in the Schedules attached hereto and forming part of this By-law:

Schedule "A" - Administration

Schedule "B" - Building Department

Schedule "C" - Cemeteries Schedule "D" - Fire/Rescue

Schedule "E" - Licensing and Lotteries Schedule "F" - Planning Department

Schedule "G" - Recreation Schedule "H" - Public Works

Schedule "I" - Water & Sewer Rates

2. The fees and charges as set forth in each schedule attached hereto, shall come into effect on the 1st day of January, 2011.

By-law No. 73-10 Page 2 of 2

- 3. All fees and charges will be subject to applicable taxes [including but not limited to, Provincial Sales Tax (P.S.T.), Goods and Services Tax (G.S.T.) and Harmonized Sales Tax (H.S.T.).
- 4. All charges payable under this by-law including taxes, interest and collection costs constitute a debt of the person or persons charged and if unpaid, where permissible, shall be added to the tax roll for any property in the Township of Wellington North owned by such person or persons and may be collected in the same manner as taxes, in accordance with Section 398 *Municipal Act*, 2001 S.O. Chapter 25 as amended.
- 5. This by-law shall be known as the "Fees and Charges By-law".

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WELLINGTON NORTH

BY-LAW NUMBER 74-10

BEING A BY-LAW TO PROVIDE FOR A DRAINAGE WORKS IN THE TOWNSHIP OF WELLINGTON NORTH IN THE COUNTY OF WELLINGTON, KNOWN AS THE FURMANEK DRAIN

<u>AUTHORITY</u>: Drainage Act, R. S. O. 1990, c. D.17, as amended, Section 87. Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25, as amended, Sections 5 (3), 11 (1) 6

WHEREAS the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25, as amended, Section 5(3), provides that the jurisdiction of every council is confined to the municipality that it represents and its powers shall be exercised by by-law.

AND WHEREAS the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25, as amended, Section 11 (1) 6 provides that every council may pass such by-laws respecting matters within the sphere of jurisdiction relating to Drainage and Flood Control.

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Wellington North has received a petition in accordance with the provisions of the Drainage Act to provide for a Drainage Works in the Township of Wellington North in the County of Wellington known as the Furmanek Drain, and for borrowing on the credit of the Township of Wellington North the sum of \$402,220. for completing the Drainage Works.

AND WHEREAS the requisite number of owners have petitioned the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Wellington North in the County of Wellington in accordance with the provisions of the Drainage Act, requesting that certain lands and roads be drained by a drainage works.

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Township of Wellington North has procured a Report by K.A. Smart, P. Eng., Drainage Engineer of the firm of K. Smart Associates Ltd., 85 McIntyre Dr., Kitchener, Ontario and the said Report is attached as Schedule A of this By-law.

AND WHEREAS the Council is of the opinion that the Drainage Works as described therein is desirable.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Wellington North, pursuant to The Drainage Act, enacts as follows:

- 1. The Report is hereby adopted, and the Drainage Works as therein indicated and set forth is hereby authorized and shall be completed in accordance therewith.
- 2. The Corporation of the Township of Wellington North may borrow on the credit of the Corporation the sum of \$402,220.00 being the funds necessary for the Drainage Works provided that the sum be reduced by the amount of commuted payments with respect to the lands and roads assessed.
- 3. For paying the sum of \$402,220 the amount being charged against such lands and roads for benefit and for paying the sum of \$172,732 the amount being charged against the lands and roads for outlet in the Township of Wellington North apart from lands and roads belonging to or controlled by the Municipality and for covering interest thereon at the rate of 6% per annum or such rate as required at the time of borrowing, the following total special rates over and above all other rates shall be assessed, levied and collected upon and from the parcels of land and parts of parcels and roads shown in Schedule A, and the amount of total special rates and interest against each parcel or part of parcel or road respectively shall be paid in full by each assessed owner thirty (30) days after invoicing. Any amount remaining unpaid at the expiration of the thirty (30) days shall be charged interest at the rate of 1.25 % per month or such rate as is imposed at the time of collection; any amount remaining unpaid for a period of three (3) months shall be collected in the same manner and at the same time as all other taxes assessed, levied and collected; providing that no greater amount shall be levied than is required after taking into account and crediting the amount of grants under Section 87, The Drainage Act, and any other grant or commuted payment which may be applicable.

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WELLINGTON NORTH

BY-LAW NUMBER 77-10

BEING A BY-LAW TO CONFIRM THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WELLINGTON NORTH AT ITS REGULAR MEETING HELD ON SEPTEMBER 27, 2010.

AUTHORITY: Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25, as amended, Sections 5(3) and 130.

WHEREAS the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25, as amended, Section 5(3), provides that the jurisdiction of every council is confined to the municipality that it represents and its powers shall be exercised by by-law.

AND WHEREAS the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25, as amended, Section 130 provides that every council may pass such by-laws and make such regulations for the health, safety and well-being of the inhabitants of the municipality in matters not specifically provided for by this Act and for governing the conduct of its members as may be deemed expedient and are not contrary to law.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the Township of Wellington North hereby **ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:**

- 1. That the action of the Council at its Regular Meeting held on September 27, 2010 in respect to each report, motion, resolution or other action passed and taken by the Council at its meeting, is hereby adopted, ratified and confirmed, as if each resolution or other action was adopted, ratified and confirmed by separate by-law.
- 2. That the Mayor and the proper officers of the Township are hereby authorized and directed to do all things necessary to give effect to the said action, or to obtain approvals where required, and, except where otherwise provided, the Mayor and the Clerk are hereby directed to execute all documents necessary in that behalf and to affix the corporate seal of the Township to all such documents.
- 3. That this by-law, to the extent to which it provides authority for or constitutes the exercise by the Council of its power to proceed with, or to provide any money for, any undertaking work, project, scheme, act, matter or thing referred to in subsection 65 (1) of the Ontario Municipal Board Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter 0.28, shall not take effect until the approval of the Ontario Municipal Board with respect thereto, required under such subsection, has been obtained.
- 4. That any acquisition or purchase of land or of an interest in land pursuant to this by-law or pursuant to an option or agreement authorized by this by-law, is conditional on compliance with Environmental Assessment Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter E.18.
