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## David Parker, President, Wellington Federation of Agriculture Re: Livestock Damage by Coyotes

Mr. Parker appeared before Council to discuss livestock damage by coyotes. Farmers are avid supporters of preserving wildlife as well as other environmental protection initiatives, such as the Rural Water Quality Program. Through the Environmental Farm Plan many have invested in improvements to address the conflict with wildlife by building predator fences and making purchases of livestock guardian animals such as sheep dogs, llamas and donkeys. Farmers often carry the majority of the burden when it comes to losses of crops and animals due to wildlife. A recent report estimates losses due to wildlife at \$41 million annually. The loss of sheep to predators has increased by nearly 50% in the last decade.

Mr. Parker encouraged municipalities and residents to continue doing what they have been doing to fight the coyote problem. The status quo is the way to go while waiting for nature to take its course in reducing coyote populations. The risk of predator attacks on sheep are going to increase as the size of flocks goes up. Farmers can help by eliminating deadstock, particularly sheep, from areas where coyotes can get at it.

RE: 2009 unaudited financial statements

Accompanying this report is the financial statement for the fiscal year ended December 31, 2009. Councillors will note that there is not an auditor's report attached and is therefore not audited. The report is not attached as the statements are not in compliance with the CICA Public Sector Handbook. The handbook introduces, beginning with the 2009 fiscal year, the recognition of all tangible capital assets in the annual financial statements. This is a requirement for all Ontario municipalities. "Tangible Capital Assets" are defined as all of the equipment, vehicles, buildings, and property owned by the Township.

In order to comply with this new reporting criteria it is necessary to inventory all of the tangible capital assets of the Township, establish the historical cost of those assets, and calculate the current net book value of those assets. This project has not been completed at this point. This information has to be audited prior to incorporating it in the Township financial statements.

Despite the delay in assembling this information, it was decided to prepare financial statements in the same manner as in prior years and present them to Council. Except for the recognition of tangible capital assets the information presented is no different than it would have been had the asset information been included. The Township auditors have reviewed the information included in the attached statement with the Finance Committee but do not provide an audit opinion at this point.

## **Consolidated Fund Position:**

The consolidated fund position is summarized in Note 3. Due to significant capital expenditures in the water department, this department has been carrying a large deficit for several years. This deficit has been offset by a large surplus in the sewage department. The rates charged for sewage include a capital component but over the years capital expenditures have not been significant relative to the water system creating the surplus noted. In 2009 there were significant sewage capital expenditures using a lot of this surplus. As well, due to a significant increase in the rates charged by Wellington North Power for the Township streetlights, this area rate has a large deficit that will have to be recovered in future years as the local area tax rate increases to cover the higher operating costs.

The general operating fund is ending the year with a surplus of \$384,377 which is higher than in 2008 (\$347,932).

#### Grants:

During 2009 the Township was successful in its application for grants under the Build Canada Fund, the Infrastructure Stimulus Fund, and the Recreational Infrastructure Canada Fund. These grants were provided equally by the provincial (1/3) and federal governments (1/3) with the Township required to provide the remaining third. These projects were started in 2009 and will be completed in 2010. In addition to the grants noted, grants received from the province late in 2008 were used in 2009 to complete the funding of the "Big Dig" and to finance work done in 2009 on rural roads.

## Wellington North Power:

The Township's share of the net income or loss earned by Wellington North Power is included in these financial statements. In 2009 the amount reported is \$514,320. This income is the result of a non-energy rate increase awarded the utility in 2008.

## **Capital Fund:**

In 2009 the fire departments of Wellington North were completely outfitted with new self containing breathing apparatus (SCBA). This purchase was funded from a reserve fund for fire equipment.

As noted earlier, there was significant amount of rural resurfacing and construction. This work was funded with provincial grants received in 2008.

The first phases of the renovation work at the Arthur Community Centre were completed. The parking lot was reconstructed and a new floor was put down in the main hall. The new elevator will be installed in 2010. This work has received 2/3 funding under the Recreational Infrastructure Canada Fund.

The reconstruction of Normanby Street was completed in 2009. This work was the first phase in the construction of the new Durham Street Pumping Station. This project has received 2/3 funding under the Build Canada Fund.

The reconstruction of Main Street in Mount Forest that was begun in 2008 was completed in 2009. This project received significant funding from provincial grants.

The final work was completed on the Mount Forest Sports Complex in 2009 along with the purchase of a new ice resurfacer for the new facility.

In 2009 the new sewage treatment plant in Mount Forest was opened. This project received 2/3 funding under the Canada-Ontario Municipal Rural Infrastructure Fund (COMRIF).

## Long Term Debt:

A new debenture was issued early in 2009 to fund the contribution received over 8 years from Southgate and ongoing efforts of the Mount Forest Sports Complex Fundraising Committee. As funds are received from these 2 sources they will be applied against the annual payments on the debt.

#### 7 Pension agreements

The municipality makes contributions to the Ontario Municipal Employees Retirement Fund (OMERS), which is a multi-employer plan, on behalf of 36 members of its staff. This plan is a defined benefit plan which specifies the amount of the retirement to be received by the employees based on the length of service and rates of pay. The amount contributed to OMERS for 2009 was \$127,952 (2008 \$120,994).

#### 9 Trust funds

The trust funds administered by the municipality amounting to \$246,932 (2008 - \$235,668) have not been included in the consolidated statement of financial position nor have the operations been included in the consolidated statement of financial activities.

#### 10 Subdivision agreements

As part of various subdivision agreements, the municipality has received letters of credit or cash deposits to cover developers' responsibilities in completing the projects as well as covering unpaid municipal levies. Letters of credit and cash deposits held by the municipality at December 31, 2006 amount to \$1,627,427 (2008 - \$1,806,475).

## 11 Contingencies

A number of appeals of the current value assessment of properties in the municipality are currently in process. The impact on taxation revenue as a result of these appeals is not determinable at this time. The effect on taxation of the settlement of these appeals will be recorded in the fiscal year in which they can be determined.

#### **12** Comparative amounts

The comparative amounts presented in the financial statements have been reclassified to conform to the current year's presentation.

## 13 Commitments

The Township of Wellington North has committed to a construction contract for the reconstruction of Egremont Street. The total contract is \$2,597,000. As at December 31 2009 a total of \$172,000 was spent.

The Township has committed to purchasing a pumper fire truck for an estimated \$448,000. It is expected to be delivered in 2011.

The Township has committed to a construction contract for the the construction of the Cork Street Pumping Station. The total contract is \$1,011,000.

- B. Stephen Henry Hummel is the registered owner of the following lands:

Park Lot 5 on the south side of Clyde Street in the former Town of Mount Forest in the Township of Wellington North, in the County of Wellington having Property Identifier Number 71075-0082 (LT) ("the Property").

- C. The said registered owner has applied to the County of Wellington Planning and Land Division Committee (herein called "the Approval Authority") for a consent to sever the Property pursuant to Section 53 of the Planning Act into one (1) severed lot and a retained parcel under Application Number B51/10.
- D. This Agreement is being made to address Conditions of Approval that have been established by the Approval Authority for the property and orderly development of the Property as authorized by Section 51 (25) (d) of the Planning Act and the requirements of Wellington North.

## NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WELLINGTON NORTH enacts as follows:

- 1. The Mayor and the Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to sign a Severance Consent Agreement on behalf of The Corporation of the Township of Wellington North in substantially the same form as the draft Severance Consent Agreement with Stephen Henry Hummel on behalf of The Corporation of the Township of Wellington North attached hereto as Schedule 1.
- 2. The Clerk is directed to cause the Severance Consent Agreement to be registered on the title to the Property after it has been duly signed by the parties.

## **DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT**

AGREEMENT made this day of October, 2010, pursuant to Sections 51, 51.1 and 53 of the *Planning Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c.P.13, as amended.

#### BETWEEN:

## THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WELLINGTON NORTH (hereinafter called the "Township")

OF THE FIRST PART,

- and -

## STEPHEN HENRY HUMMEL (hereinafter called the "Owner")

OF THE SECOND PART.

WHEREAS the Owner has been granted consent to sever his lands in accordance with conditions of approval issued by the County of Wellington Planning and Land Division Committee on its File No. B51/10 (the "Application");

AND WHEREAS the conditions of approval of the Application require the Developer to satisfy the local municipality in regards to future connection to municipal services and building envelopes at the time of issuance of the Certificate of Consent for the proper and orderly development of the subject lands;

NOW THEREFORE this Agreement witnesses that in consideration of the premises, other good and valuable consideration and the sum of Two Dollars (\$2.00) of lawful money of Canada, now paid by each of the parties hereto to each of the other parties hereto (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), the parties agree as follows:

ARTICLE ONE - IDENTIFICATION OF LANDS APPROVED FOR DEVELOPMENT

1.1 Leg al Description

The Owner's land consists of the property described as Park Lot 5 South of Clyde Street, Plan of Mount Forest; Wellington North (the "Lands").

- 1.2 <u>Severed Parcel</u> The severed parcel consists of the property described as Part Park Lot 5 South of Clyde Street, Plan of Mount Forest, Part 1 on 61R11461; Wellington North.
- 1.3 <u>Retained Parcel</u> The retained parcel consists of the property described as Park Lot 5 South of Clyde Street, Plan of Mount Forest except Part 1 on 61R11461; Wellington North.

## ARTICLE TWO - IDENTIFICATION OF PLAN(S)

- 2.1 <u>Building Envelope Plan</u> The Owner has filed a building envelope plan for each of the severed and retained parcels with the Township.
- 2.2 <u>Building Envelope</u> No building shall be built outside the building envelopes.
- 2.3 <u>Road Entrance</u>

The Township approves of the road entrance for the severed parcel and the retained parcel.

#### ARTICLE THREE – PARKLAND

#### 3.1 <u>Payment in Lieu of Parkland Conveyance</u>

A payment is required in lieu of a conveyance of parkland for each new building lot created by the Application, in the amount of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) to be paid prior to the Township clearing the conditions with the Land Division Committee.

#### ARTICLE FOUR - WELL AND SEPTIC SYSTEM

4.1 Well and Septic System

The Owner is permitted to build a residence on the severed parcel and retained parcel, utilizing a well and septic system subject to compliance with the law of Ontario and the Township's by-laws and applicable policies.

#### **ARTICLE FIVE - FUTURE SERVICES**

#### 5.1 <u>Municipal Water and Municipal Sanitary Sewers</u>

The Owner agrees forthwith at the request of the Township to connect to municipal water and to municipal sanitary sewers for the severed lands and retained lands when these services are available and pay all costs and levies in accordance with the by-laws and policies of the Township.

#### 5.2 Frontage and Connection Charges

Without limiting paragraph 5.1, the Owner agrees to pay all frontage charges and connection charges for the severed lands and retained lands when these services are provided.

ARTICLE SIX - REGISTRATION OF AGREEMENT

#### 6.1 <u>Registration Prior to Permit Issuance</u>

The Agreement will be registered against the title to the Lands and the Owner will pay for the cost of registration.

#### **ARTICLE SEVEN - GENERAL PROVISIONS**

#### 7.1 <u>Notices</u>

Any notice, invoice or other writing required or permitted to be given pursuant to this agreement (including notice of a change of address) shall be deemed to have been given if delivered personally to the party or to an officer of the applicable corporation or if delivered by prepaid first class mail, on the fourth day after mailing. The address for service for each of the parties is as follows:

#### 7.2 <u>Township Costs Recoverable Like Taxes</u>

Notwithstanding any other remedy available to the Township, the Owner acknowledges and agrees that any expense incurred by the Township in connection with the preparation, registration, administration, implementation and enforcement of this Agreement, and specifically the maintenance obligations, may be recovered by the Township in like manner as municipal taxes pursuant to the provisions of Section 427 of the Municipal Act, 2001.

7.3 <u>Waiver</u>

It is expressly understood and agreed that remedies of the Township under this Agreement are cumulative and the exercise by the Township of any right or remedy for the default or breach of any term, covenant, condition or agreement herein contained shall not be deemed to be a waiver or alter, affect or prejudice any other right or remedy or other rights or remedies, to which the Township may be lawfully entitled for the same default or breach; and any waiver by the Township of the strict observance, performance or compliance by the Owner of or with any term, covenant, condition or agreement herein contained, or any indulgence granted by the Township to the Developers shall not be deemed to be a waiver of any subsequent default or breach by the Owner, nor entitle the Owner to any similar indulgence heretofore granted.

#### 7.4 Execution in Counterparts and Transmission by Facsimile

This Agreement may be executed in several counterparts, each of which so executed shall be deemed to be an original and such counterparts together shall constitute one and the same agreement. This Agreement, or its counterparts, may be sent and received by facsimile or similar electronic transmission and the communication by such means will be legal and binding on all parties.

7.5 <u>Enurement</u>

This Agreement shall enure to the benefit of and be binding upon the parties hereto, their respective heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns.

## BY-LAW NUMBER 79-10

## BEING A BY-LAW TO CONFIRM THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WELLINGTON NORTH AT ITS REGULAR MEETING HELD ON OCTOBER 4, 2010.

AUTHORITY: Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25, as amended, Sections 5(3) and 130.

**WHEREAS** the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25, as amended, Section 5(3), provides that the jurisdiction of every council is confined to the municipality that it represents and its powers shall be exercised by by-law.

**AND WHEREAS** the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25, as amended, Section 130 provides that every council may pass such by-laws and make such regulations for the health, safety and well-being of the inhabitants of the municipality in matters not specifically provided for by this Act and for governing the conduct of its members as may be deemed expedient and are not contrary to law.

**NOW THEREFORE** the Council of The Corporation of the Township of Wellington North hereby **ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:** 

- 1. That the action of the Council at its Regular Meeting held on October 4, 2010 in respect to each report, motion, resolution or other action passed and taken by the Council at its meeting, is hereby adopted, ratified and confirmed, as if each resolution or other action was adopted, ratified and confirmed by separate by-law.
- 2. That the Mayor and the proper officers of the Township are hereby authorized and directed to do all things necessary to give effect to the said action, or to obtain approvals where required, and, except where otherwise provided, the Mayor and the Clerk are hereby directed to execute all documents necessary in that behalf and to affix the corporate seal of the Township to all such documents.
- 3. That this by-law, to the extent to which it provides authority for or constitutes the exercise by the Council of its power to proceed with, or to provide any money for, any undertaking work, project, scheme, act, matter or thing referred to in subsection 65 (1) of the <u>Ontario Municipal</u> <u>Board Act</u>, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter 0.28, shall not take effect until the approval of the Ontario Municipal Board with respect thereto, required under such subsection, has been obtained.
- 4. That any acquisition or purchase of land or of an interest in land pursuant to this by-law or pursuant to an option or agreement authorized by this by-law, is conditional on compliance with Environmental Assessment Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter E.18.
