Ms. Dickson reviewed the Report on the 2011 Emergency Management Programme for Wellington North. The report outlined how the Township of Wellington North has fulfilled, for 2011, the municipal emergency management programme requirements set out in the Regulations of the Emergency Management and Civil Protection Act. The Programme Committee met on March 18, 2009. No changes were proposed to the Emergency Response Plan in 2011. The primary focus for training in 2011 was the Provincial Incident Management System (IMS) 200 course for the control group members, a workshop for Elected Officials and a Media Training Workshop for Emergency Information Officers, the Mayors and their alternates. Additional emergency management training included Provincial Basic Emergency Management Courses, Scribe Training and a Shelter Workshop.

On May 18, 2011 an emergency management exercise was conducted involving members of the Township's Municipal Emergency Management Control Group and support staff. Staff will review and update critical infrastructure information throughout the year as changes are noted. Public education included the annual set up of displays at the Arthur and Mount Forest Libraries along with a draw for a 72 hour emergency kit; and Emergency information displayed at the Township Municipal Office and a draw for a weather radio. The City and County were successful with their funding bid for an interoperability strategic plan. The Township is continuing an audit of generator needs in the municipality. Many lessons learned and recommendations have been noted from the Sandy Lake Community Evacuation Response from July 2011.

For the past 10 years of her life, getting her home for Christmas or a birthday proved to be a 2week job with substantial cost. However,I feel the time has come for us to take advantage of this valuable service available to us.

Our son attends the day program at Community Living and must attend various appointments in and out of town. While we have a modified vehicle that we use to transport him when we can, the fact that we have to earn a living to support ourselves and him means that work schedules often conflict with the times that he must travel to and from his program and appointments. We used to make use of the accessible transportation in Mount Forest, but since it has ceased operations, we have no way to transport our son when one of us must use our van for work or other necessary appointments. The time when he travels to program conflicts with school transportation schedules, making it difficult to access the services that are available and the cost of any others is out of reach.

We are writing to you to express our support for bringing Saugeen Mobility and Regional Transit into our community. It would solve many of our transportation concerns and enable us to continue to support our son at home, something that becomes more and more challenging as time goes on. We believe he has the right to full access to his community at an affordable cost.

Andy reviewed the historical data from 2001 to 2011 noting the growth in taxes levied over the years, how the major operating grants (OMPF) has decreased over the years, and how the annual inflation has changed over the years.

Andy reviewed the known projects and budget issues that are anticipated next year and the funding of those items over a 5 year period. These items included the replenishment of reserves used to fund unforeseen expenditures in 2011, 3 new fire trucks over the next few years, construction of a new pool in Mount Forest, the proposed full time fire chief, and the initiation of a disabled transit service.

John noted that the "capital debt" repayment noted in the supplied information could be considered aggressive and that Council may wish to extend the repayment over a longer period.

Sherry suggested that the disabled transit service should not be funded from the tax levy. She suggested that other providers be approached.

Dan pointed out that he had been asked to provide a report regarding a disabled transit service. The report was provided and Council indicated that they would make a decision on October 17, 2011. The Township should seek out other funding partners.

Sherry pointed out that, in the financial analysis of the impact of the introduction of the service, the increase in cost rises significantly over the time period. Andy indicated that the data for the first 2 years had come from Dan's report and that the next 3 years data had been from a conversation with the Town of Hanover. He acknowledged that the increase in the cost to the Township over the time period may be more aggressive then it will be.

Dan commented on the proposed new pool in Mount Forest. He indicated that if the Township is intending on significant fundraising that that exercise be started soon.

Brant County Council approved the following resolution at their meeting held on September 20, 2011:

"Whereas Ontario Regulation 282/98 of the Municipal Tax Act classifies commercial grain elevators as an industrial use;

And whereas this classification has resulted in significant increases in property taxes for commercial grain elevator operators, resulting in higher costs to grain farmers and the loss of local businesses and jobs;

And whereas the 2002 Beaubien Report on Property Assessment and Classification Review recommended that grain elevators be removed from the industrial property class and included in the commercial class because they do not manufacture, produce or process anything;

Be it hereby resolved that the Council of the County of Brant supports the requests from the Ontario Agri Business Association and the Grain Famers of Ontario to the Minister of Finance and the Minister of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs that Ontario Regulation 282/98 (Section 6(2), Paragraph 4 of The Municipal Tax Act) be amended to reflect that "elevators used to receive, store, clean, treat or transfer feed for livestock or grain" are removed from the industrial property class and included in the commercial property class;

And further that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Ontario Federation of Agriculture, the Rural Ontario Municipal Association and to all rural municipalities in the Province of Ontario for their support."

As the resolution states, this matter negatively affects commercial grain elevator operations and farmers through increased costs for drying their grain. We request your serious consideration of this request.

BEING A BY-LAW TO TEMPORARILY CLOSE PORTIONS OF MAIN STREET, KING STREET AND FERGUS STREET, MOUNT FOREST FOR THE PURPOSE OF HOLDING A SANTA CLAUS PARADE

AUTHORITY: Municipal Act, 2001, S.0. 2001, Chapter 25, as amended, Section 45.

BY-LAW NUMBER 78-11

BEING A BY-LAW TO AMEND ZONING BY-LAW NUMBER 66-01 BEING THE ZONING BY-LAW FOR THE TOWNSHIP OF WELLINGTON NORTH (111 Frederick Street West, former Village of Arthur – O'Neil and Craig)

WHEREAS, the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Wellington North deems it necessary to amend By-law Number 66-01;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Wellington North enacts as follows:

- 1. THAT Schedule "A" Map 2 to By-law 66-01 being the Zoning By-law for the Township of Wellington North is amended by changing the zoning on the land described as 111 Frederick Street West, Township of Wellington North (formerly Village of Arthur), as shown on Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of this By-law from "C1 Central Commercial Zone" to "C1-31 Central Commercial Exception Zone".
- 2. THAT Section 31, Exception Zone 1 Arthur Village, is amended by the inclusion of the following new exception:
 - "31.31 C1-31 In addition to the permitted uses of Section 16.1, the existing building on the land zoned C1-31, may also be used entirely for residential, without commercial use of the ground floor. Any future alterations or additions to the building shall comply with all requirements of the Residential (R2) zone -Section 12.2. Notwithstanding Section 6.1.4(ii), or any other section of this by-law to the contrary, an accessory building shall not exceed 148.64 sg. m. (1,600 sg. ft.)."
- 3. THAT except as amended by this By-law, the land as shown on the attached Schedule 'A' shall be subject to all applicable regulations of Zoning By-law 66-01, as amended.
- 4. THAT this By-law Amendment shall come into effect upon the final passing thereof pursuant to Section 34(21) and Section 34(22) of The Planning Act, R.S.O., 1990, as amended, or where applicable, pursuant to Sections 34(30) and (31) of the Planning Act, R.S.O., 1990, as amended.



EXPLANATORY NOTE

BY-LAW NUMBER 78-11

THE SUBJECT LAND is described as 111 Frederick Street West, Township of Wellington North (formerly Village of Arthur).

THE PURPOSE AND EFFECT of the amendment is to change the zoning of the subject property to recognize an existing legal non-conforming use. For a period of time part of the ground floor has been used for commercial purposes. The Central Commercial C1 zone requires at least 51% of the ground floor area to be in commercial use. This amendment permits use of the entire ground floor for apartments. The rationale for this is that the building was originally constructed for residential use. In addition, an accessory building not to exceed 1,600 sq. ft. is permitted.

BY-LAW NUMBER 79-11

BEING A BY-LAW TO CONFIRM THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WELLINGTON NORTH AT ITS REGULAR MEETING HELD ON OCTOBER 17, 2011.

<u>AUTHORITY</u>: Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25, as amended, Sections 5(3) and 130.

WHEREAS the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25, as amended, Section 5(3), provides that the jurisdiction of every council is confined to the municipality that it represents and its powers shall be exercised by by-law.

AND WHEREAS the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25, as amended, Section 130 provides that every council may pass such by-laws and make such regulations for the health, safety and well-being of the inhabitants of the municipality in matters not specifically provided for by this Act and for governing the conduct of its members as may be deemed expedient and are not contrary to law.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the Township of Wellington North hereby **ENACTS AS FOLLOWS**:

- 1. That the action of the Council at its Regular Meeting held on October 17, 2011 in respect to each report, motion, resolution or other action passed and taken by the Council at its meeting, is hereby adopted, ratified and confirmed, as if each resolution or other action was adopted, ratified and confirmed by separate by-law.
- 2. That the Mayor and the proper officers of the Township are hereby authorized and directed to do all things necessary to give effect to the said action, or to obtain approvals where required, and, except where otherwise provided, the Mayor and the Clerk are hereby directed to execute all documents necessary in that behalf and to affix the corporate seal of the Township to all such documents.
- 3. That this by-law, to the extent to which it provides authority for or constitutes the exercise by the Council of its power to proceed with, or to provide any money for, any undertaking work, project, scheme, act, matter or thing referred to in subsection 65 (1) of the <u>Ontario Municipal</u> <u>Board Act.</u> R.S.O. 1990, Chapter 0.28, shall not take effect until the approval of the Ontario Municipal Board with respect thereto, required under such subsection, has been obtained.
- 4. That any acquisition or purchase of land or of an interest in land pursuant to this by-law or pursuant to an option or agreement authorized by this by-law, is conditional on compliance with <u>Environmental Assessment Act</u>, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter E.18.
